#### **Year 10 Geography Fieldwork**

Year 10 students completed their physical fieldwork for their GCSE Geography course on Thursday and Friday in the first week of June. It was a river study on the Easedale Beck in Grasmere. On day 1, in glorious weather, the students measured the width, depth and velocity of the river at 3 different sites along the river and were able to analyse the results over the next few lessons. On day two the same data was collected, but in pouring rain! Despite the inclement weather on day 2, the students on both days showed an excellent dedication to their studies, getting stuck in with all the measuring and recording tasks that they are taught in lessons, and showing the value of taking the classroom outdoors.















#### **Molly Warburton Visit**

Molly Warburton, a singer-songwriter was in school last week working with Years 7, 8 and 9. She ran a workshop where she shared some of her music, her career journey so far and also spoke to students about how to take care of their mental health, social media and the importance of respect.

Many students came up to speak to her at the end, talking about things ranging from how to succeed as a musician to mental health and even to what it's like growing up in Carnforth.






# PLANS IN PLACE


















#### **Year 10 GCSE Information Evening**

#### **Super Sports Day**

Carnforth High had their annual sports day on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> June. The pupils chose their events prior to the day and had been briefed on their activities in preparation for the day. The list of activities that ran was lengthy. Hopefully there was something for everyone, and all pupils could enjoy their day.

The activities that ran on the day were Shot Put, Discus, Javelin, 100, 200, 300m sprints, 4x100m relay, Long Jump, Triple Jump, Handball, tag rugby, football, ultimate frisbee, corner ball, old school sports day e.g. sack race, obstacle race, three legged races, the tug of war, fitness challenges, indoor curling, target practice, archery, laser pistol, dodgeball, crown green bowling, twister and board games, duathlon, gladiators duel, bungee run and table tennis.

#### **Sports Transport and Fixture Payments**

The PE department is offering the opportunity for parents to make a one-time payment at the start of the 2023/24 academic year of £25 to cover their child's extra-curricular fixture transport payments. Currently the PE department charges £1 for home fixtures and £2 for away fixtures, this covers a percentage of cost for transport and competition fees, this will remain in place for parents who do not wish to make the £25 one-time payment. We believe that this for some parents will be a preferential method of payment for their child's sporting fixtures throughout the school year.
