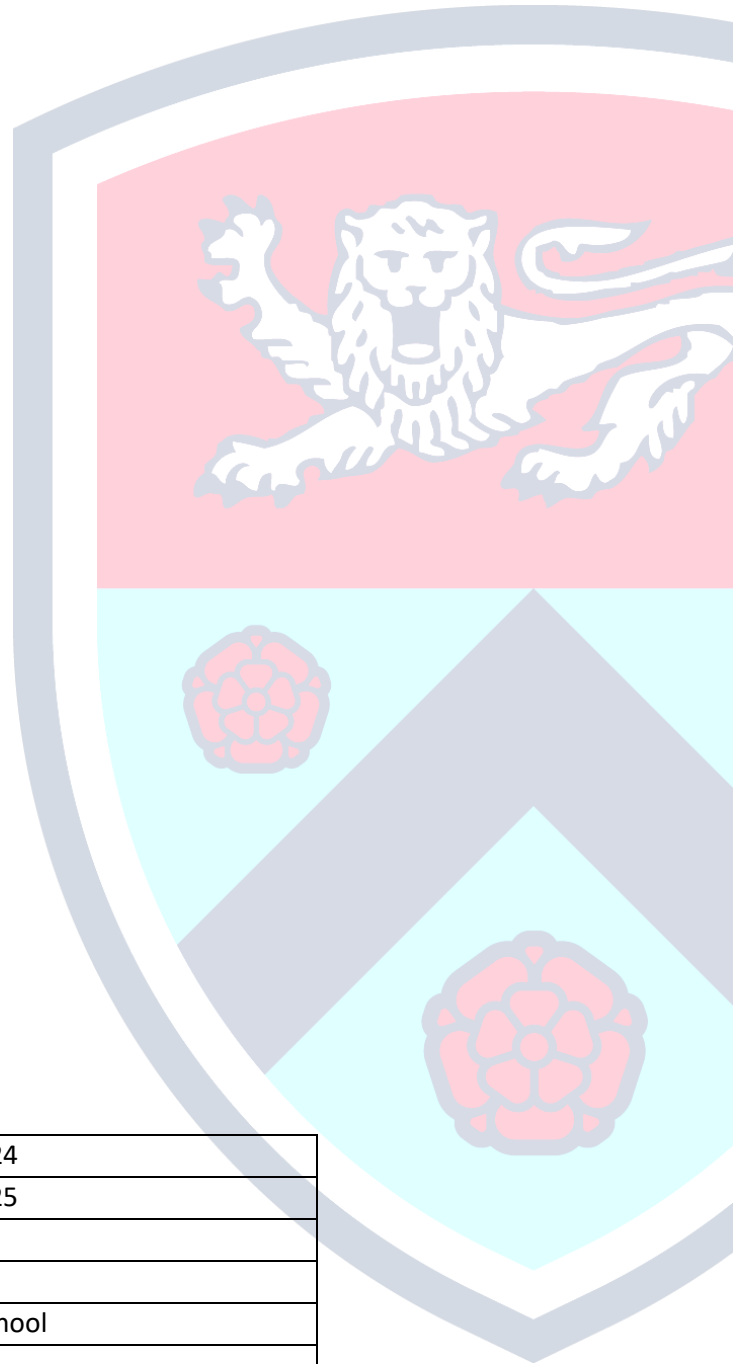

1. Roles and Responsibilities

- 1.1. Carnforth High School has overall responsibility for the effective operation of this policy. The **Governing Body** is responsible for approving this policy and monitoring its effectiveness.
- 1.2. The Governing Body has delegated day-to-day responsibility for operating the policy to the Headteacher.

2. Aims

2.1. This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

3. Carnforth High School's Legal Duties Under the Equality Act 2010

- 3.1. The [Equality Act 2010](#) prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.
- 3.2. To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils
- Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)
- Allow all pupils to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents to get in touch with Ms Carrington, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

4. Introduction and Principles

4.1. School uniform plays an important role in establishing the ethos of a school and is strongly encouraged by the DfE. At Carnforth High School we believe that our uniform policy benefits the school in several ways:

- It encourages pupils to identify with the school and nurtures the notion of community
- It protects children from social pressures to dress in a particular way
- It supports discipline and good behaviour
- It instils a sense of pride in the school
- It promotes more effective teaching and learning
- It is not a prohibitive factor for any family applying for admission to Carnforth High School

4.2. The appearance of pupils is also an important factor at Carnforth High School in promoting good behaviour and ensuring the health and safety of pupils and staff.

4.3. The Government, although it has published guidance, has made it clear that it is for the school's Governing Body to decide whether there should be a uniform and other rules relating to appearance, and if so, what

they should be. Therefore, this document seeks to clarify the Governors' expectations at Carnforth High School regarding uniform and appearance.

- 4.4. The list of the acceptable, not acceptable and supplementary items pupils are permitted to wear is within this document.
- 4.5. This includes items parents can apply to the Headteacher for permission to wear. A judgement will be made regarding any request based on whether the item is in sympathy with ethos of the school or any other judgement including health or safety. The Headteacher in consultation with pastoral colleagues will consider each application and reach a decision as soon as possible but until such time as a decision is made the item should not be worn for school.
- 4.6. Parents/Carers are asked to contact us if they are in any doubt about any item of uniform or issue of presentation for their child so that they can clarify what is acceptable before agreeing to permanent or semi-permanent changes in appearances or sending the child to school wearing those items of which they are unsure, for example piercings.

5. Limiting the Cost of School Uniform

- 5.1. Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory [guidance](#) from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.
- 5.2. We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that have to have a school logo or a unique fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

5.3. We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers

5.4. We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible. Carnforth High School therefore only requires a jumper/ blazer, tie and PE kit to be branded.
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveller
- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different year/class/house groups
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items

- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes
- Consulting with parents and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy

5.5. We have launched our own online uniform store this year to make the purchasing of uniform easier. This enables us to use the best value manufacturers to provide our school uniform items. We also sell stationary via the online store to ensure good values for parents.

5.6. Uniform can be bought online at www.carnforthhighuniform.com . Orders are delivered directly to pupils when available. Alternatively, school uniform is available from Uniform and Leisure, 15 Common Garden Street, Lancaster or Euston Road, Morecambe. Some items can also be purchased from online stores:

6. Basic Uniform Requirements

6.1. The lists below shows the essential uniform items.

Uniform Requirements

- School jumper*
- School blazer* (compulsory for Year 7, optional for Years 8-10)
- School tie*
- Plain black pleated skirt
- Black school trousers
- Pale Blue (year 7,8 & 9) White shirt (year 10 & 11)
- Black or flesh coloured tights or black or white ankle socks
- Black shoes (heel no higher than 3cms, **not** stilettos, boots, trainers, ballet/dolly/canvas shoes)

P.E. and Games Equipment

Essential

- Trainers (preferably running trainers)
- short sleeve training top*
- training shorts or skort or leggings*
- socks*

Optional

- ¼ zip training top*
- full zip training top *

Required for football/ rugby/ hockey

- football boots (moulded or metal studs)
- gum shield
- shin pads

It is expected that all pupils bring their full PE kit and get changed for PE lessons whether they are taking an active part in the lesson or not.

6.2. School clothing and sportswear marked with an asterisk (*) can only be purchased through our school uniform shop (online orders available) or our supplier The Uniform & Leisurewear Co. Common Garden Street, Lancaster/Euston Road, Morecambe (01524 388355) <http://www.ualonline.com/>. All items are embroidered with the school crest or logo where applicable. Other items can be purchased through a store of choice.

7. Detailed Guidance

7.1. We give below some notes for guidance and clarification. School uniform lists can sometimes seem over detailed and over particular. Our experience is that we prevent misunderstandings by being very precise about our requirements. We of course do not wish for parents to spend money on items we do not allow to be worn. The full support of parents is expected with regards to their children wearing the correct uniform.

8. Breaches of Policy

- 8.1. The Uniform and Appearance Policy will be strictly enforced. Every opportunity will be given for pupils to conform to the uniform policy and rectify any identified issues.
- 8.2. Pupils will be directed to replace any part of their uniform which does not conform to this policy with spare uniform, kept in the pastoral office. This includes shoes, skirts and trousers.
- 8.3. In the case of piercings, pupils will be asked to remove the piercing. Parents are asked not to allow pupils to have piercings that cannot be removed.
- 8.4. Every arrangement will be made to facilitate the pupil to go home to replace/ remove unacceptable uniform or change appearance if this cannot be done in school. If it is not possible for pupils to go home to change, they will have lessons in the internal suspension unit until such time as they conform to the policy.
- 8.5. If a pupil refuses to replace unacceptable uniform/ remove piercings, jewellery etc. They will have lessons in the Internal Suspension room. Parents will be notified.
- 8.6. Minor breaches of uniform or appearance will result in a sanction, at the discretion of the pastoral team or other staff. The standard sanction is a negative ‘uniform’ point. When a pupil amasses 5 of these, a lunchtime detention is awarded. This resets every half-term.
- 8.7. The Headteacher or member of the senior leadership team may ask a pupil to go home briefly to remedy a serious breach of the school’s rules on appearance or uniform. This will count as an authorised absence for as long as the absence is strictly necessary. The parent/guardian of the child will be contacted in this instance.
- 8.8. Schools can refuse to allow a pupil to come into school for failing to wear the uniform or maintain the appearance required by the school. This is not a suspension. A suspension is refusing to admit to the

school; in the case of a breach of uniform the school is willing to admit the pupil but insist that they are properly dressed.

8.9. The school is always the final arbiter of what constitutes appropriate and acceptable dress and appearance.
