# **Sports Leaders – Primary School Sports Athletics**

On Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> November, CHS welcomed students from seven local primary schools for an athletics event. Twelve of our wonderful Year 9 Sports Leaders helped to lead the day and ensure that the visitors had a good competition. One of our Sports Leaders, Harry, reported:

"We were responsible for overseeing the events during the athletics competition. For example, I had to time the primary school students while they were competing, alongside Harrison who was keeping track of score and adding this into the computer to work out how many points each competitor received. For each station we were responsible for, we had to show the younger students how to complete the event and to make sure that they were following the rules and staying safe while taking part. Some sports that they took part in included: speed bounce, long jump, javelin (primary school style!) and target practice. There were also running events. This was a great opportunity for us to develop our own understanding of sport while helping younger students to grow and have fun."







# Knife Crime Assemblies

Sadly, knife crime is an issue we see all too often in the news. Members of Lancashire Constabulary, in association with the Lancashire Violence Reduction Network, recently visited our school to talk to students in all year groups about the realities and dangers of carrying a knife. Students learnt about statistics and laws related to knife crime, considered why people may choose to carry a knife and what the short and long term consequences could be, as well as looking at ways to deal with injuries related to blades. Students know that they can talk to any member of staff in school to get support if they have any worries or concerns, but they were also told about other groups they can contact anonymously outside school. **EMPLOYMENT** 

A criminal record may prevent you from doing certain jobs. This is particularly the case in law, accounting, healthcare, and childcare.

Certain courses won't accept people with a criminal record.

#### RAVEL

Many countries have bans against people who were involved in criminal activities. When it comes to living abroad, while it depends on the country, it's difficult if not impossible to achieve with a criminal record.

HOUSING

A criminal record can lead to difficulties in getting a mortgage and even being evicted from rental properties.



# It is against the law to carry a knife in public place.

Unless the blade is less than 3 inches long and is a manual folding blade. Doing so can carry a prison sentence of up to 4 years even if it is not used in England & Wales, and 5 years in Scotland. It is also against the low to carry a knift on behalf of someone else

A person must be 18 or over to purchase

a knife. This includes cutlery and kitchen knives. In Scotland, people between the ages of 16 and 18 can legally purchase cutlery and kitchen kniver.

If the blade is less than 3 inches in length and is a manual folding blade, A person over the age of 16 can purchase this knife.



#### It is illegal to bring into the country, sell, possess, hire or give someone a banned knife.

Banned knives include: butterfly knives, disguised knives, flick knives, and zombie knives. A full list of banned knives in the UK can be found on the GOV website.

# Year 10 Work Experience Launch

If you are the parent of a Year 10 student you will have received an emailed letter about Work Experience of Friday last week, just after our launch to Year 10 students on Enrichment Day 1. We are using 'Unifrog' for the administration of Year 10 Work Experience this year. **Placements must be organised by the student and yourself**. Through Enrichment Days, assemblies, form times, our newsletter, information on our website and other events in school, we will also support the students with this process. All students need to be out on work experience during the work experience week. The student must identify and make contact with employers that they would like to have a placement with for the week, which is Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> – Friday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2025. If the employer initially agrees to the placement, the student will need to make note of their contact details, including name and email address.



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

Colne scored a third goal, with 15 minutes to play. Again, another superb solo goal to give the Colne number 9 his hat trick. This time curling the ball into the bottom corner from 20 yards to beat James in goal.

Carnforth didn't roll over at this stage and had big chances through Tom and Oliver but did not manage to find the back of the Colne net to set up a nervy finish. Well done to all the Colne and Carnforth players on such a well spirited, competitive match.
