


Pre-Loved Revision Guides for Sale to Year 11!




As a result, we will be selling revision guides in school on Friday 7th February. Each guide will be £3. More information about this will be shared with students in form time next week!

In Memory of Mrs Reeves

Many of you will remember Mrs Reeves, who passed away last year. She was involved in many school Iceland trips and loved taking the students to experience new things. Although ambitious, we decided we would work together to collectively travel the 961 miles between Carnforth High School and Reykjavik to raise money for a commemorative bench for Mrs Reeves within school. Since launching the fundraiser our staff, pupils and their families have been completing miles by running, walking, cycling, swimming and even skipping! This has involved a park run with 12 staff, 1 ex-colleague and 8 students on Saturday 25th January. It felt so lovely for everyone to come together in our mission to reach Iceland and everyone was cheering everyone on despite there being lots of different abilities. Thank you to our students, Maisie, Mary, Alfie, Ethan, Austin, Emily, Robert and Ava for joining us. You did amazing!

In addition, Mary has completed a number of additional miles. Independently, outside of school Madison, has also completed 15 miles, Annie has completed 12 miles, and Millie has swum some miles during her swimming training. Well done everyone!

Additionally, in school a number of students have signed up to 'clock in' miles in the fitness suite. The students exercised tirelessly on the treadmills, ellipticals, bikes, rowers and stepper machines, throughout their break and lunchtimes all this week. Collectively they have proudly added 135.4 miles to the total!

As a school we are immensely proud of how everyone has come together along with their friends and family to virtually get to Iceland and raise money to purchase a sensory bench in memory of Mrs Reeves who has always talked about the school needing a sensory area.



Bronze Science Awards



Year 9 Handball Tournament

The Year 9 boys travelled to Our Lady's for a district handball tournament. The first game was a tough 7-2 defeat against a strong LRGS side. The second match was a much more competitive, end to end match vs OLCC. OLCC edged the game, winning 6-4. The final game was a closely fought contest vs a second LRGS side, who won 1-0. Three really good fixtures, where the Carnforth boys displayed some excellent attacking and defending skills.



Year 8 Boys Football Fixture vs Morecambe

The Year 8 boys fixtured Morecambe Bay Academy in a friendly football fixture, the game was a very close contest. With limited chances for both sides. Dan forced the Morecambe goalkeeper into two good saves in the first half, with the best Carnforth chances. Morecambe scored twice inside the final 10 minutes to win the match 2-0.



Year 9 Football Tournament

The Year 9 boys hosted Penwortham Priory in the third round of the Lancashire Cup. Carnforth made an electric start to the match leading 4-0 inside the first 20 minutes, centre forward Theo with a first half hat trick and Kenzie adding a 4th with a tidy finish on the counter.

Penwortham pulled a goal back on the stroke of half time to give themselves a glimmer of hope. Penwortham scored the first goal of the second half, a neat finish from 6 yards to beat Archie in goal. Carnforth responded fantastically though, and Theo scored his 4th goal of the game quickly followed by an excellent strike from George across the goalkeeper and off the far post into the bottom corner. Theo then scored another, with the goal of the game, a chip over the goalkeeper from 20 yards. George scored from close range in the final minutes to crown off the victory 8-2. This takes Carnforth into the quarter final of the Lancashire cup, where they will travel to Burscough.





Year 8 Boys RFU Rugby Festival

The Year 8 boys rugby team travelled to Preston Grasshoppers to compete in the RFU under 13 rugby festival. The standard was very high across all fixtures, with a number of schools across Lancashire attending. The first two games were both 3-0 defeats to strong Hutton and Bury Grammar School sides. Carnforth got on the score board in the third game, winning 4-1 against Ormskirk High School, Dan scoring a hat trick of tries whilst Jacob scored the fourth. A superb response to two challenging opening fixtures. The fourth and final game was a 1-0 defeat in a close game vs St Edwards from Liverpool. Mr Chambers named Jacob his player of the tournament, as he relentlessly tackled and rucked to win possession of the ball. Well done boys.



Year 7 Girls Netball Matches

The Year 7 girls travelled to MBA to play 2 matches this week. They played a strong Year 8 side first followed by MBA's Year 7 side. The first match proved a fantastic opportunity as the girls stepped up to play a strong year 8 side. During the first half our girls held their own, had great marking, and kept the score tight at 3-1. During the second half CHS conceded 2 more goals to make the overall score 5-1. However, all girls played fantastically, their teamwork was brilliant, and they did not let their head go down. They should be very proud with that score knowing they were playing a team a year older than them.

The Year 7's then went on to play their second match against MBA's Year 7 team. Here our players talents shone brightly. Their passing skills were excellent down the court, with all players relentlessly finding space and executing the ball swiftly into the D. Both shooters were on fantastic form and at the end of both halves the score was 5-0. Players of the match was awarded to Dava and Kaitlyn respectively. With a special shout out to Mabel and Mia for their defensive plays when intercepting and retrieving the ball and regaining possession.



Year 10 Netball Match

Year 10 also travelled to MBA to play netball this week. The squad of only 7 players worked extremely hard during all 4 quarters to secure victory over their MBA counterparts. During the four quarters the girls played to their strengths, with quick succession of passes down the court and tactical centre pass play.

The MBA side were strong in attack, making our defence work hard to regain possession, however this was done exceptionally in order to keep a clean sheet in the first quarter and the goal difference to a minimum. CHS attacking play was also great, with players finding the space, evading their opposition and shooting from all angles in the D. Overall CHS won, with the final score of 8-2, player of the match was awarded to Kiera.

Extra-Curricular Sport Payment

The PE department is offering the opportunity for parents to make a one-time electronic payment of £25 to cover their child's annual extracurricular transport payments. Currently the PE department charges £1 for home fixtures and £2 for away fixtures; this covers a percentage of cost for transport and competition fees. Parents will be able to make the payment on the School Gateway. It is hoped that parents find this a preferential method of payment, for those students who are regular team members, rather than paying in cash on the day of the fixtures.
